

A better travel-day record for your advisor

Tax residence and immigration reviews often begin with a simple question: where were you, and on which dates? Keep the answer current instead of rebuilding it at filing time.

THE HABIT

Record each border crossing while it is fresh.

Enter the country, arrival date, and departure date. Review any GPS-assisted suggestion before saving it. Correct a mistake as soon as you find it.

Keep these details

- 1 Every arrival and departure date
- 2 The country or territory for each stay
- 3 Notes for transit, disputed, or exempt days
- 4 Documents that can support the timeline

Bring this to your advisor

- 1 A CSV export of the trip history
- 2 The rule and period you were monitoring
- 3 Dates you are unsure how to count
- 4 Questions about treaties, ties, or exceptions
